The seven steps of evidence-based practice. Evidence-based practice was originally described as a five-step process including (Sackett et al., 2000): Ask the clinical question in PICOT format. Search for the best evidence. Critically appraise the evidence. Integrate the evidence with a clinician's expertise and a patient's preferences and values.
