Because integrative health care is inherently collaborative, it presents dangers of kickbacks and fee-splitting, as well as prohibited self-referral. If Medicare- or Medicaid-reimbursed services are provided, then the integrative healthcare practitioner must consider federal law (i.e., Stark and federal anti-kickback law) as well as state law prohibitions against self-referral, kickbacks, and fee-splitting.
