If Windows Vista asks for an administrator password, type the password. Follow the wizard instructions to choose a restore point.

Basically a manual copy and rename of the backup registry files from System Volume Information\Restore PointXXX to C:\Windows\Config. It works quite well. I tried booting to BartPE in Vista and I don't see the same folders/files in the System Volume Information folder in Vista.

System Restore takes a "snapshot" of the some system files and the Windows registry and saves them as Restore Points. When an install failure or data corruption occurs, System Restore can return a system to working condition without you having to reinstall the operating system.

The System drive is selected by default, but if you have more than one drive, you can create a restore point for any of them. If you select an additional drive, you'll notice that the Create button dims. To create the restore point, click Apply.

How to Create a System Restore Point in Windows Vista ...

Open the Backup and Restore menu by clicking Start, clicking Control Panel, clicking System and Maintenance, and clicking Backup and Restore Center. Click Advanced Restore. Click Files from a backup made on a different computer, and then click Next.

If you're able to boot into Windows, then using System Restore to set your computer back is easily achieved by going to Start -> All Programs -> Accessories -> System Tools -> System Restore, and then selecting a restore point from before the issues started.

Restore Unbootable Windows System using Offline System ...

Here's how to use System Restore to manually create a system restore point: In the search bar on the taskbar, type system restore. A list with search results appears. Click the Create a Restore Point search result. The System Properties window opens.

How to Manually Create a System Restore Point in Windows ...

If the screen is blank, you can then click the Arrow next to the Video Camera icon and choose Same As System (or you may see Integrated Camera) or a more specifically-named webcam from the list.
